**Sermon** addresses two distinctive features frequently recurring in his frequent visits to their significances in Matthew: one as sincere care or mercy; the other as the final judgement. The former may be called the “ministry of mercy” while the latter is viewed as the judgement of Jesus at the end time. As we are called out of the world, Jesus sends us back to the world to live a life that resembles his life on earth. He reached out from heaven to earth, from the earth to the cross, and then from the cross to heaven and yet living among us in and through the Holy Spirit. Even amid tough situations, the sermon reflects on the significance of outreaching care with the love, which we have experienced with him. This outreaching, sincere care is humble, small, and unrecognizable just as the left hand does not know what the right hand does. Yet, it will be paid off greatly with the privilege of entering the kingdom of heaven.

## Renewal of Our Faith in “The Apostles’ Creed” (on the Screen)

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth;

And in Jesus Christ his only Son, our Lord;  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried;  
the third day he rose from the dead;  
he ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church,  
the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

## The Scripture of the Day (from NRSV)

### Matthew 25:31-41, 44-46 in the New Testament

<sup>31</sup> “When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. <sup>32</sup> All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, <sup>33</sup> and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left.

<sup>34</sup> Then *the king* will say to *those at his right hand*, ‘Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; <sup>35</sup> for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, <sup>36</sup> I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.’ <sup>37</sup> Then the righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? <sup>38</sup> And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? <sup>39</sup> And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?’ <sup>40</sup> And the king will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, *just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.*’

<sup>41</sup> Then *he* will say to *those at his left hand*, ‘You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; <sup>44</sup> Then they also will answer, ‘Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of

you?’<sup>45</sup> Then he will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, *just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.*’<sup>46</sup> And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.”

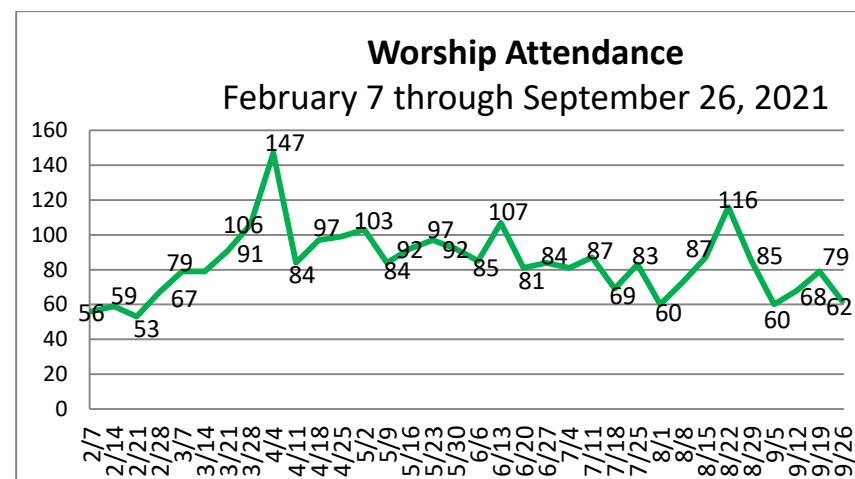

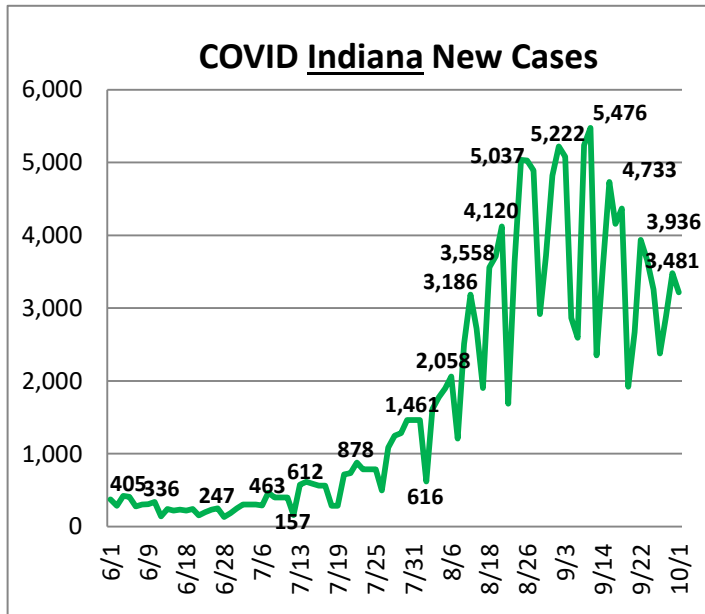

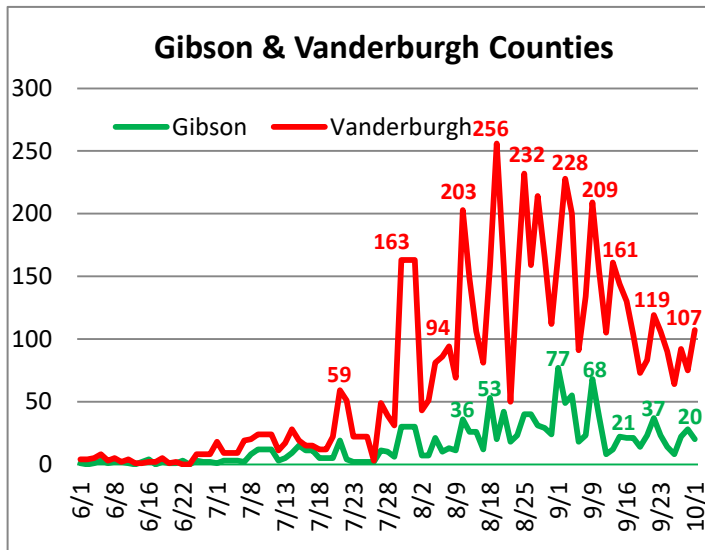
## TRUNK OR TREAT TIME!
